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‘Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital’ Inaugurates Knowledge Station at Mabarrat Um Al Hussein

Her Royal Highness Princess Basma Bint Talal, in the presence of HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, founder and chairman of Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital (TAG.GD), and the Republic of South Africa’s Ambassador to Jordan, HE Ms. Tselane Mokuena, along with a number of ambassadors from friendly countries and senior officials, inaugurated a Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Knowledge Station at Mabarrat Um Al Hussein. The Knowledge Station was established as a contribution from TAG.GD in partnership with the Embassy of South Africa in Jordan.

GD. It is also equipped with training equipment and facilities designed to provide an integrated digital learning environment, deliver interactive training programs, and connect beneficiaries to TAG.GD's network of knowledge stations.

On this occasion, Her Highness Princess Basma affirmed the importance of providing education and knowledge for underprivileged groups, especially youth, pointing out that such initiatives represent an investment in human capital and the empowerment of future generations.

She further highlighted the importance of partnerships between national and international institutions in supporting development efforts, praising the role that Mabarrat Um Al Hussein plays in providing care for children and developing their capacities.

Abu-Ghazaleh Shared TAGTech's Experience and Expressed Readiness to Establish a Smart Technology Factory in Tunisia

HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, founder and chairman of Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital (TAG.GD), received in his office in Amman a high-level delegation from Tunisia, headed by Minister of Foreign Affairs, Migration and Tunisians Abroad, HE Mr. Mohamed Ali Al Nafti.

The delegation included the Ambassador of Tunisia to Jordan, HE Ms. Moufida Al-Zaribi, the Chef de Cabinet of the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Migration and Tunisians Abroad, Mr. Fethi Ben Maaouia, and the Director General of Maghreb, Arab and Islamic Organizations Directorate at the Ministry, HE Ambassador Mr. Al Hashmi Ajili

At the meeting, Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh welcomed the delegation, emphasizing his pride in the



long-standing relations with Tunisia, recalling the recognition he received from the founder of modern Tunisia HE Habib Bourguiba, which he considers an immense source of pride.

He further highlighted TAG.GD's efforts and activities, with special focus on Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Technology (TAGTech), a member of TAG.GD, noting that its factory is the first of its kind to manufacture smart devices including laptops, smart phones, tablets and accessories whose quality competes with that of global corporations.

Additionally, he underlined the importance of localizing the technology industry, saying that the world is experiencing a critical historical phase where the need for technology is escalating, at the time where political turmoil threatens supply chains, making localization a necessity for every country that seeks to protect itself from such instabilities.

Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh expressed his readiness to establish a technology manufacturing factory in Tunisia, similar to the TAGTech factories operating in Lebanon, Egypt, and Jordan.

He went on to mention the TAG.GD Polytechnic Project which is to be launched this August, saying that this global initiative will lead the transformation in education to bring about a modern, technical education that is based on current and future sciences.

Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh explained that this project aims to digitally build skilled generations equipped with the competencies needed to engage in the knowledge revolution we are experiencing, in addition to graduating students ready to compete and enter the global labor market. He added that it represents an opportunity for all peoples of the Global South.

For his part, the Tunisian Minister HE Mr. Al-Nafti praised the significant efforts made by Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh in serving the nation and its future generations, expressing his deep pride in visiting Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital, which has expanded beyond national borders and spread across the world.

His Excellency recalled the historic moments that brought Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh together with the founder of modern Tunisia, Mr. Habib Bourguiba, saying, “That meeting was a recognition of your scientific and scholarly standing and prestige.”

Mr. Al-Nafti affirmed that his country relies on three fundamental pillars to which it gives utmost priority: education, health, and women’s rights, noting that Tunisia, which is honored to host one of the offices of the Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital, has always been a destination for Arab scholars and intellectuals.

Furthermore, Mr. Al-Nafti extended an invitation to Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh to visit Tunisia and meet with Tunisian President His Excellency Kais Saied, in light of the President’s strong focus on education and digital transformation, in which the country has made significant and advanced progress, positioning itself to be fully prepared for the global future.

Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh's Interview in the 'Kalam Business' Program 88 Years of Success for the Founder of the Arab World's Largest Intellectual Property Empire

HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, founder and chairman of Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital (TAG.GD), believes that true wealth is not measured by property or financial assets, but rather by the knowledge and ideas an individual possesses. He stresses that his global organization was founded upon an early commitment to the knowledge economy and intellectual property rather than oil, trade, or manufacturing, starting in 1960s long before most people in the Arab region even recognized this field.

During an extensive interview with the program Kalam Business (Business Talk) on CNN Business Arabic, Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh reviewed his journey spanning more than 80 years. It started with a Palestinian child forcibly displaced from Jaffa in 1948, to later becoming the founder of one of the Arab world's largest institutions operating in intellectual property, accounting, consulting, and technology. Today, TAG.GD has over 140 firms and around 100 offices across the globe, employing nearly 2,000 professionals.

From Refugee Child to a Man with a Mission

Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh recalled the details of his forced displacement from Jaffa at the age of ten, noting that his family left believing their departure would only be temporary, but soon realizing they had lost everything they had possessed.

He recalled that on the ship, his father, who had owned businesses, factories, and companies in Palestine, told him, «We have lost everything.» However, the young boy responded with a question that changed his entire life, «Did they take your mind? Did they take your education? Did they take your knowledge?» This was the moment at which he decided that excellence would be his core mission, saying, “My mission is excellence. I do not want to be the richest or the most famous. I want to excel”.

He added that success was never a financial goal for him, but rather a means to prove the capability of the Arab individual to compete globally.

He explained that hardship was never an obstacle in his life, but rather the greatest driver to keep going, saying, «It is one of God's blessings upon me that I suffered», emphasizing that difficult circumstances forced him to excel in his studies while working at the same time; which he credits as a major factor in building his character.

Starting from Selling Ice Cream to Founding a Global Empire

Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh shared that he started working at the age of twelve, first as an ice cream vendor before taking jobs in a music record store, and later at a vegetable market. Throughout this period, he walked four hours a day to and from school before receiving a full scholarship to the American University of Beirut (AUB) thanks to his excellence. He pointed out that work played a role in his journey as a «blessing» rather than just a way to earn money, stating that his greatest lesson from that period was that one can transform suffering into a positive driving force if managed wisely.

Moreover, he mentioned that the first significant sum he earned came after winning a short story competition during his university years. Rather than spending the prize on himself, he purchased a refrigerator, an oven, and a washing machine for his mother, recalling that moment as one of the happiest of his life as it brought comfort to his family for the first time after much hardship.

From a Car Trunk to the World's Largest Organization

After years of working at one of the largest accounting firms in Kuwait, Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh decided to establish his own company in 1972, without an office or capital. He recalled that his first meetings were held on the sidewalk, while client files were kept in the trunk of his car, before a businessman donated an office space free of charge upon learning of his situation.

Looking back on that period, Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh stated that all he possessed at the time was «the idea,» while no one understood why he insisted on founding a firm specializing in intellectual property. Many even considered the project an unrealistic venture, destined to fail.

He went on to share that TAG.GD needed five full years before it stopped incurring losses and achieve financial stability, relying during that period on bank loans and relentless effort to sustain its operations. He stressed that the determination to build a global Arab company was the goal from day one, saying, “Since the company’s establishment, we announced that the world needed an Arab company among the global giants”.

The Largest Company Worldwide. How Intellectual Property Made TAG.GD’s Wealth

Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh believes that many people still misunderstand the nature of the TAG.GD’s business, explaining that its greatest value does not lie in factories or warehouses, but rather in knowledge, databases, and accumulated expertise.

He revealed that over decades, TAG.GD has built a database comprising of nearly every intellectual property right registered worldwide. This enables it to verify trademarks and patents within seconds; a process that previously required correspondence with dozens of countries.

He noted that just ten years after its establishment, TAG.GD became the largest intellectual property firm in the world, stating, «We started in 1972, and by 1982 we were the largest IP firm globally. Today, we are not just the largest, but the largest by far.»

Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh declined to discuss his personal wealth, stating that the circulating estimates regarding TAG.GD’s value is based on the worth of the name and expertise, rather than traditional assets. He added, «I am broke... all profits are reinvested to defend our future.»

«Rest Kills»: An 88-Year-Old Management Philosophy

Despite reaching the age of 88, Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh asserts that he still continues working «eight days a week,» explaining that he sometimes wakes up at 2:00 or 3:00 AM to write down his ideas or dictate them to members of his team. He considers traditional rest has never been part of his approach to life.

«Extra comfort is harmful to health,» he stated, explaining that if human beings stop using their mental and physical faculties, they begin to deteriorate progressively. He added that maintaining success is far more difficult than achieving it.

Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh further explained that he does not manage TAG.GD through daily top-down commands, but rather through reports and data analysis. He emphasized that he leaves the final decision to the executive manager in charge, limiting himself to advising and offering his opinion, which he considers one of the most important secrets behind the institution’s sustainability over the decades.

He also summarized his philosophy of success into three core principles: Never view failure as the end of the road, look at problems as opportunities to learn from, and believe that “happiness is a decision”.

Why He Continues to Invest in Hardware Manufacturing Despite Early Losses

At a time when many companies are reducing their industrial investments, Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh revealed that TAG.GD manufactures and produces laptops, tablets, smartphones, and educational devices under the TAGTech brand, despite admitting that this activity has yet to generate profits, believing that this investment is oriented toward the future. He explained that the world might face severe supply chain disruptions due to escalating geopolitical and trade competition between the United States and China, which could open doors for new regional producers.

He said that the Arab world must have the capability to manufacture technology itself rather than remaining mere consumers. Innovation and invention, he added, have become the true source of national power, not oil or conventional manufacturing.

He noted that a single invention could be worth the economy of an entire country, citing global tech giants that built their trillion-dollar market values on ideas and knowledge rather than physical assets.

Self-Sufficiency and Innovation: A Vision for the Future Economy

In the decades ahead, Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh believes that a nation’s power will no longer be determined by its oil reserves or natural resources. Instead, true national power will depend on the ability to achieve self-sufficiency in food, medicine, technology, and innovation, criticizing some countries’ reliance on imports under the pretext of lower costs, stressing that local production, even if more expensive initially, creates jobs, preserves the economy, and reduces foreign dependency.

He reiterated that the future will be based on the knowledge-based economy, stating, «The value of a single invention can equal the economy of an entire country.»

He added that the Arab region still needs to instill a culture of innovation from the earliest stages of education, noting that he has established a fund to support innovation. Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh revealed that he ensures that family members go to train in Silicon Valley to understand how ideas can be transformed into global enterprises.

It is worth mentioning that these remarks come at a time when the world is witnessing an accelerating race in Artificial Intelligence (AI) and intellectual property, with the value of intangible assets rising to constitute the largest share of the market value of major global corporations. This reflects the ongoing shift toward the knowledge economy, a macro-trend that Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh accurately anticipated more than half a century ago.

‘Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital’ Presents its AI and Cybersecurity Vision at 2026 Kazan Forum

Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital (TAG.GD) took part in the 17th International Economic Forum titled ‘Russia – Islamic World: Kazan Forum’, held in Kazan, the capital city of Tatarstan, May 12-17, 2026 with a wide international participation.

During the Forum, Mr. Khaled Khader, Artificial Intelligence (AI) Department Manager at TAG.GD, represented HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, TAG.GD founder and chairman, as a speaker in four specialized sessions.

In the first session under the title “Exporting Information Technology Solutions to the Islamic World”, Mr. Khader outlined TAG.GD’s vision toward cooperation in the fields of AI and cybersecurity, pointing to the Jordan’s aspiration for collaboration with Tatarstan and Russia in such areas.

He further stated the importance of enhancing digital sovereignty and shifting from a software-leasing model toward a model of joint development among Arab countries, Russia, and Tatarstan, affirming TAG.GD's corporate capabilities through its more than 100 offices worldwide.

During the event, Mr. Khader announced the forthcoming launch of Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital Polytechnic, featuring dedicated schools of AI and cybersecurity, in partnership with edX, MIT, Harvard, and IBM.

In the following session, Mr. Khader participated as a designated co-moderator alongside Mr. Alexey Bonkov, head of Advanced Research at Russia's Internet Development Institute.

The session served as the media conference forum of Russia-Islamic World Strategic Vision Group, held on May 14, 2026, and focused on the use of AI in journalism and media, combating deepfakes and misinformation, and preserving cultural and spiritual heritage in the era of digital transformation.

In the 3rd session entitled "Creative Economy, organized by Chamber of Commerce and Industry of the Russian Federation, Mr. Khader participated as a speaker, tackling intellectual property monetization and the creative economy.

He also outlined the four main mechanisms for monetizing intellectual property: licensing, joint ventures, co-development, and digital distribution. He drew upon the experience of Abu-Ghazaleh Intellectual Property (AGIP), established in 1972, as a leading institutional model in the field.

Mr. Khader also referred to the book "Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh: The Mind Behind the Machine"-the first book authored by AI about the life journey and writings of an individual without human guidance, as a live example of AI-generated intellectual property. He emphasized that the Arab and Islamic worlds are creative and knowledge partners, not merely consumer markets.

In recognition of his contribution, the Chamber of Commerce and Industry of the Russian Federation awarded Mr. Khader an official letter of appreciation.

Mr. Khader further participated in the 4th session titled “Russia–Middle East and North Africa: Innovative Development of the Creative Economy.” In the opening, he presented a practical bilateral proposal aimed at bridging creative technical education between the Middle East and North Africa and Russia through linking the Universal University of Russia with the TAG.GD Digital Polytechnic initiative.

In this session, Mr. Khader underlined the framework of technology, talent, and trust as the three pillars of cooperation between the MENA region and Russia. He also presented the TAG.GD Digital Polytechnic as a gateway for introducing Russian AI and cybersecurity curricula into Arab markets and called for the establishment of a formal educational exchange mechanism connecting a partner Russian university with TAG.GD Digital Polytechnic.

Among the distinguished participants in this session was Mr. Alexander Krainov, director for Development of AI Technologies at Yandex.

Mr. Khader also received a formal letter of appreciation from Ms. Taliya Minullina, member of the Federal Organizing Committee and a member of the Government of the Republic of Tatarstan, in recognition of his participation in the Conference.

It is worth mentioning that the Conference recorded unprecedented levels of international participation this year, attracting more than 23,000 participants representing 99 countries. It also witnessed the signing of dozens of international agreements and received extensive global media coverage.

Russian President Mr. Vladimir Putin sent an official welcome message to the participants, considering that the Kazan Forum serves as the leading economic platform for dialogue between Russia and the member states of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) and has been granted federal status by presidential decree.

Al-Fayez: Jordan is Among the Leading Arab Countries in Digitalization

Al-Amleh: Innovation is No Longer an Intellectual Luxury but a Prerequisite for Survival

With a wide local and Arab participation from knowledge-based institutions and entities, the ‘Innovation in Times of Challenges’ Forum was organized by Talal Abu-Ghazaleh Global Digital (TAG.GD), the Arab Network for Creativity and Innovation (ANCI), Arab Satellite Broadcasting Organization, and Arab Forum for Smart Cities.

During the opening ceremony, Senate President HE Mr. Faisal Al-Fayez stated that knowledge, creativity, and innovation represent the foundation of societal development and progress. He further stressed that Jordan is among the leading Arab countries in the field of digitalization and has successfully established a dynamic innovation ecosystem under the leadership of His Majesty King Abdullah II and His Royal Highness Crown Prince Al Hussein bin Abdullah II.



He also stressed that every aspect of human life will increasingly depend on our ability to transition from the present into the future, pointing out that the Forum will encourage the youth to explore the world of innovation and praised the continuous initiatives undertaken by TAG.GD in various fields, especially knowledge-based endeavors and activities, which represent a model of how the private sector can contribute to advancing development.

HE Dr. Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, TAG.GD founder and chairman and chair of the Board of Trustees of the Arab Network for Creativity and Innovation, stated that investing in the future is the most valuable investment and the path to success for individuals, institutions, and nations alike. He affirmed that knowledge and innovation are the cornerstones of progress.



Furthermore, Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh pointed out that innovation is a limitless field that is equally open to every individual and institution. He expressed confidence that the Arab world is capable of reestablishing its position as a global leader, as it did for centuries in the past.

In this context, he announced the launch of the Arab Commission for Supporting Investment in Innovation, noting that TAG.GD is preparing to launch a scientific and technical project aimed at creating a new educational framework that will ensure graduates are equipped with the skills demanded by the labor market.

For his part, Mr. Fahd Al-Amleh, ANCI secretary-general, said that the Forum conveys a clear message that the Arab youth are not a generation living on the margins of the future, but rather one capable of leading it. He also emphasized that innovation is no longer an intellectual luxury, but a prerequisite for survival.

“Nations that do not produce knowledge will remain dependent on those that do. The Arab nation remains capable of achieving extraordinary accomplishments and securing its right to progress and achievement,” he said.



Meanwhile, Lebanon's former Minister of National Defense HE Mr. Yacoub Al-Sarraf presented a political and intellectual perspective, warning against the diversion of Western innovation toward the development of instruments of destruction, including military artificial intelligence (AI), cyber threats, and phone surveillance technologies. He cautioned against Arab preoccupation with internal disputes at the expense of addressing existential challenges.

Mr. Al-Sarraf also introduced the concept of "digital resistance" and preserving authentic collective memory, citing the efforts of Dr. Abu-Ghazaleh in this regard. He called on the Arab Network for Creativity and Innovation to lay the foundation for the Arabization of the digital sphere by developing software solutions rooted in the Arabic language as a primary framework, rather than merely translating or replicating Western systems and applications.

Additionally, Jordan's former Minister of Labor Dr. Nidal Al-Qatamin stated that innovation, while serving as the primary driver of progress throughout the First, Second, Third, and Fourth Industrial Revolutions, is now presenting unprecedented challenges to humanity, particularly in light of the rapid advancement of AI technologies. He noted that experts widely agree on the seriousness of the coming phase, as its greatest impact will be felt in employment and traditional markets amid the growing dominance of a limited number of major technology companies over the global economy.

Dr. Al-Qatamin pointed out that only seven companies in the US market are now worth more than one-third of the total value of the American economy. He predicted that before 2030 the world might witness the emergence of a company valued at more than USD 10 trillion, reflecting the scale of the ongoing global economic transformation and its profound implications for the future of humanity.

Absentee Property and Its Current Owners - Jaffa, a City that Never Left Me

I never know whether memory deceives me or grows clearer as time passes, but Jaffa in my earliest childhood was never just a city on the sea; it was a space breathing warmth, familiarity and affection to the rhythm of the scent of orange blossoms. Back then, my grandfather Tawfiq's hotel was far more than a place visited by passersby as exile later taught me, but a living piece of the city and the heartbeat of its people, until the turning point in 1948.

We left. I say this now as though the action of leaving was simple. Departure at that age is not a fully understood concept in the mind of an eight-year-old child. It was closer to a sudden disconnection; the



sea was clearer to me than any abstract idea, and I watched everything from behind, looking backward rather than forward, until we finally arrived in Beirut. Since that day, I have never stopped looking at the shore of the “Bride of the Sea” from afar, as though the city is still calling me with the voice of truth. It is not a matter of mere nostalgia, but an existential insistence on return, just like a tree’s right to cling to its soil. Those who built their illegitimate entity believed that time would erase everything, that the old would die and the young would forget. How wrong they were.

To this day, I still hold onto Identity Document No. 14006, issued by the Arab Higher Committee for Palestine on February 27, 1951, with its precise features and details: (My father’s name: Hajj Tawfiq Abu-Ghazaleh; my mother’s name: Adibeh; my profession: Student; and my address: Al Tareeq Al-Jadidah, Beirut.) The document’s colors may have faded with time, but it remains heavy, as though it carries within its folds the darkness of injustice and tyranny. As I started to read the world in another language, I realized the full horror of what had happened; or so it seems to me now, as I look back at the beginning from different endings.

At that time, the unjust hand of the “Custodian of Absentee Property” reached out to seize Abu-Ghazaleh Hotel, carving it up into small apartments, as a new methodology adopted by Zionism to establish settlements. The tragic irony is that the Zionist entity referred to those who were forcibly expelled or displaced from their land as “absentees,” passing the Absentee Property Law as one of three racist legislations relied upon to dispossess Palestinian properties of those who had set sail into exile.

While the thief, not the custodian of the properties was distributing the spoils, around 4,000 Palestinians remained in the city under military rule. They were confined to the “Jaffa Ghetto” or the Al-Ajami neighborhood, which the occupation authorities turned into an isolated zone surrounded by barbed wire. Most of them were unable to register their properties. At the same time, this illegitimate Zionist entity handed over their homes to housing companies; a gift from those who did not own to those who did not deserve.

Today, I find myself thinking that I did not just leave Jaffa; I left behind a version of time that was far more innocent than my current capacity to understand. Yet, the wider my world expands, the more something tightens inside me toward that original point, where everything was still possible and had not been decided. Even today, the Nakba continues in other forms: forced real estate appraisals, urban Judaization, and economic pressures designed to gradually expel the remaining people of Jaffa.

Yet, on the horizon, there are voices filled with humanity, exposing the truth in the face of this systematic elimination, such as “Zochrot” (remembering in Hebrew), which was founded in 2002 by a group of Jewish activists aimed at raising awareness among Jews in Israel of the Nakba, promoting moral accountability and supporting the right of return for Palestinian refugees. I recall the words of activist Ms. Niva Grunzweig, project manager at Zochrot, when she stated, “Government authorities are stepping up the erasure process... They are afraid of what might happen if the truth comes out”.

Not to mention Niva, the daughter of “Peace Now” activist Mr. Emil Grunzweig, who was assassinated by a Zionist extremist with a grenade hurled during a peaceful demonstration in Jerusalem in 1983. Ms. Grunzweig was right: the truth, once released from memory, does not just threaten a narrative; it shakes the very foundation of a project built on the denial of the other. Intersecting with Zochrot is the “Houses Beyond the Hyphen” initiative in Jaffa, exposing the exact same wound. In my view, living memory does not recognize intersections; instead, it creeps like wild flora between the cracks, blooming in old photographs, archived documents, and in the words of fathers passed down to their children like a never-ending will.

My insistence, and that of hundreds of thousands like me, on holding fast to the Right of Return is an act of existential resistance. A human being who surrenders the land of their ancestors, loses a piece of their soul. We have not, and we will never, surrender. Jaffa and its sister beloved Palestinian cities continue to live within us. Today, the Abu-Ghazaleh Hotel has become a layer of consciousness; one of the historical landmarks, homes, and private properties displayed as Palestinian landmarks and archaeological sites bearing witness to the Nakba.

Talal Abu-Ghazaleh, the child who departed on a boat in 1948, became a man carrying an entire, immortal city in his chest. Jaffa, no matter its name, color, or altered scent, will always keep calling its people. And its people will never grow weary.

Those journeys taught me discipline and resilience and later enabled me to build TAG.Global from a single accounting firm into a worldwide enterprise. It is this transformative power of knowledge that I wish for every Palestinian. Challenges are not barriers; they are catalysts and opportunities that create leaders capable of excelling on the global stage.

The resilience of the Palestinian people is a testament to this brave nation's capacity to innovate even in adversity. To document this excellence, I established the All4Palestine initiative, a global database cataloging the achievements of Palestinian scientists, writers, entrepreneurs, and innovators. It stands as a definitive record of intellectual achievement, countering narratives of victimhood. From the halls of the United Nations, where I once chaired the UN ICT Task Force, to the boardrooms of the world's most innovative corporations, Palestinians continue to prove that our intellectual capital is of global significance.

This agreement with the Ministry of Education provides specialized TAG-TAB devices engineered for challenging environments, supported by a comprehensive digital curriculum and classroom management platform. The Smart Bag is the gateway to the world's knowledge. It ensures that learners are not passive consumers of information, but active participants in the global knowledge economy, equipped with the critical thinking and digital literacy skills required in the era of AI. This is my commitment to the sovereignty of the mind, recognizing that the true wealth of Palestine lies in the brilliance of its people, who have great role models that have bravely weathered everything that has been put in their way.
